In case you missed it My Dear Marilyn was read over the intercom on Halloween so that the whole school could enjoy the time honored tradition of listening to a scary story on Halloween!








Storytelling has numerous important effects on our daily lives. It has been one of the most effective sources of inspiration known to man.




Remember, no matter how little you think you have there is always someone who has so much less so make sure to count your blessings on Thanksgiving and every day for that matter!

We all love games, but did you know that psychology, or the study of the mind, plays an important part in games? Games like Persona 5 can give us deep insight into how our minds work.

For context, the branch of psychology known as Jungian psychology will be explored, which focuses heavily on the way our unconscious mind (thoughts you are unaware of) communicates with our conscious mind (thoughts you are aware of).

For those who don't know, Persona 5 is a role-playing game for PlayStation made by the company Atlus. You play as the character Joker, a second-year high school student who gets expelled due to a false accusation of assault from a corrupt politician.

Following his transfer to Shujin Academy in Tokyo Japan and learning to use his newfound powers of the Personas Joker endures many trials and battles to change the hearts and minds of corrupt people and make the world a better place.

Personas are used in the game as the actual characters used to fight the evil forces in the world. To start off, the term persona is used to represent the masks we wear to cover up our pure raw selves in

The game can be examined through the lenses of Jungian psychology because we unconsciously or unkno-

History in the Movies, New Harriet Tubman Movie Shows Accurate Portrayal of Slavery Experience By Alyssa Dukes

Have you heard of the new block buster film "Harriet"? It is hard to believe it has taken so long for a box office quality movie to be made about the life of Harriet Tubman one of the most well-known American slavery abolitionists.

The fact is a lot of times Hollywood is not very accurate about history in movies but the movie Harriet is actually quite in line with historical facts. In the movie, Harriet, played by actress Cynthia Erivo, is shown as a determined African American slave. Harriet in real life was born into slavery and escaped and later made 13 missions to rescue seventy enslaved people.

She changed her slave name "Minty" to Harriet Tubman once she escaped from slavery. Harriet's codename was Moses and she was illiterate (could

not read or write) her entire life.

Both in the movie and in real life, as a teenage slave an overseer threw a metal weight at another slave, but it hit Harriet instead. As a result of the injury, she would often go into sleeping spells and was difficult to wake up.

It is said that Harriet considered the dreams she had during these sleep spells to be



God speaking to her through dream visions and her religious beliefs guided her to help slaves escape. In the movie, her visions play an important part in the saving of many slaves as well.

After she rescued most of the slaves, she had brain surgery to fix her sleeping problems. Tubman went back to save her loved ones and didn't lose any each Saturday. Once Harriet saved most of her loved ones, she was a Union Scout during the Civil War.

In real life, as a scout, she led 150 African American troops across the Combahee River in South Carolina on June 1863. She also led Union riverboats through Confederate torpedo traps, freeing 750 slaves and dropping off Union troops.

In 1869 Harriet met a man named Nelson Davis. He had been a slave in North Carolina and served as a soldier in the Civil War.

Tubman and Davis got married on March 18, 1869 at the Presbyterian Church in Auburn. In 1874 they adopted a girl who they named Gertie.

The movie does not tell Harriet's whole life history but focuses on the most famous and well known part of her life which is her role as the conductor of the underground railway used to help slaves escape slavery.

The movie is receiving a lot of praise because it shows Harriet as a strong, courageous, and independent black woman of almost super hero status. She even carries a gun!

Thanksgiving is around the corner and the Panther's Eye would like to encourage everyone to be thankful for living in a country where you have freedom and everyone's rights are protected.
