




KEY CONCEPT When naming intervals, always count the first and last letter names. For example, from A up to D is a fourth (A-B-C-D); *any* A up to *any* D is some kind of fourth, no matter what the accidental. Similarly, from A down to D is a fifth (A-G-F-E-D).


EXAMPLE 6.2: Interval sizes up to the octave



When a major interval is made one-half step smaller, it becomes *minor*. This can be done either by raising the bottom note or lowering the top note.






EXAMPLE 6.13: Bach, Invention in D Minor, mm. 1–5 Ω







Examples of Enharmonic Intervals





Inverting Intervals With the Rule of Nine




EXAMPLE 6.12: Identifying larger intervals from their inversions

(b) Identifying sixths by the quality of thirds






