AP Environmental Science and Honors Biology – Mr. Rao

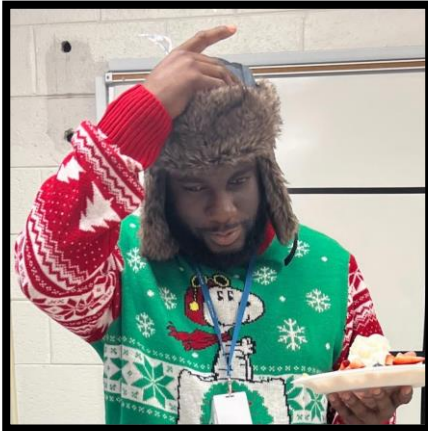
