





Downloading Canvas Courses to Use Offline on an iPhone


Open your document reader app. Search for your recently downloaded course's zip file. It will probably be stored in your phone's download folder. Click on it to select it. It will be added to your app's list of files. When you click on it, it will open the zipped folder and place an unzipped copy in your list.



Select Index to open your course. This will open your course content even when you do not have Internet access.



It will show the modules as links that you can click on to advance through the course.



Note: In the upper right hand corner, the date that you downloaded the modules is listed. This date will change each time you download modules so that you can always keep the latest files from your course.
