4. ELIGIBILITY:

Applicants classified as seniors in the Richmond County Public School System may apply. Applicants should not have received a Leroy Steed Scholarship in the past, must be residents of Augusta-Richmond County, and have attended a Richmond County high school during both junior and senior years. They must also plan to attend an accredited college or university, junior college, or technical school in the United States.

- C. Each contestant must submit two teacher recommendations on school letterhead stationery and one school counselor letter and one community or church recommendation letter. These letters must be included with the application in sealed envelopes.
- D. The School Counselor will receive your scholarship which must be submitted by December 5, 2025.

- F. All scholarships will be rewarded upon receiving the notification of Your College or Technical Institution Enrollment by mail from the institution that you have **enrolled** in by mail to RCNAA Scholarship Committee, Post Office Box 268, Gracewood, GA 30312.
 - To receive the scholarship, winners must be enrolled by the deadline of December 31, 2026. If the funds are not received by this deadline the funds will be forfeited.

Writing Tips For Essay:

- 1. Start writing early the earlier the better
- 2. Keep the essay question in mind
- 3. Don't try to write an essay from beginning to end, especially not in a single sitting ...
- 4. Write the introduction and conclusion after the body
- 5. Use 'signpost' words in your writing
- 6. Integrate your evidence carefully.

Essay should be 500 words, double-spaced, APA Style, (APA style is a widely used academic and scientific style for formatting and writing) 12-point font size, 8 ½ x 11 letter size paper.

Topics to choose from:

- 1. What 'Key of education will you use to unlock your future and how will you use that 'Key'?
- 2. How does your knowledge and understanding of the United States Constitution shape how you see your future at the community, state and federal levels?
- 3. How has your experience with your teacher, counselor, athletics department etc. contributed to your knowledge in what can be achieved in your ability to grow in your future?
- 4. How has your experience with your community, church or social organization contributed to your knowledge in what can be achieved in your ability to grow in your future?
- 5. Describe a challenging subject or concept you struggled with, the strategies you used to overcome it, and the valuable lessons learned about perseverance and critical thinking.
