



> The Pilgrims were not the only English religious group who founded a colony in New England. Members of another group called the Puritans founded the Massachusetts Bay Colony. ## A Model of Christian Charity

We are entered into [a] covenant with [God] for this work. . . . Now if the Lord shall please to hear us, and bring us in peace to the place we desire, then hath He [agreed to] this covenant . . . and will expect a strict performance of the articles contained in it; but if we shall neglect the observation of these articles . . . the Lord will surely break out in wrath against us, and be revenged of such a people, and make us know the price of the breach of such a covenant.

. . . For we must consider that we shall be as a city upon a hill. The eyes of all people are upon us. So that if we shall deal falsely with our God in this work we have undertaken, and so cause Him to withdraw His present help from us, we shall be made a story and a by-word through the world.
