The music may be downloaded from the Davidson website (Davidson.rcboe.org) under the Parent tab/Audition for your specific instrument you will be playing. | |
| Broadcasting & Film | Applicants <u>must</u> present <u>at least one</u> of the following student-created materials at the audition: A functioning media/computer presentation such as PowerPoint, DVD, movie, sequential still, etc. The production must be able to play without the software used to create it. For videos, QuickTime files are required. Note: No AVI or WMV files OR A storyboard and script for a production that has not been produced OR A video of the student on-camera for a school news broadcast Note: All content must be of appropriate language and visuals. | |
| Dance | Applicants must: Be currently enrolled and attending classes at his/her public school or after school in a dance school or ballet school. Applicants will be interviewed to discuss their training background and goals. Perform a solo that is a minimum of 1.5 minutes but no more than 3 minutes in length. The solo must be in the style of Jazz, Modern Dance or Classical Ballet. Ballet on pointe and Tap will <u>not</u> be accepted. Be properly attired in dance practice clothes and shoes appropriate for the dance style to be performed—no stage costumes. This attire may be worn underneath the dancer's street clothes and changed into upon arrival at the audition studio Provide an audio CD of their music for the audition. The music may not contain any profane or violent content. | |
| Drama | <u>Applicants must:</u> Prepare two contrasting pieces. You may choose one of the following combinations: a. One comedic monologue and one dramatic monologue of your choice. (not to exceed 90 seconds) b. One comedic monologue and one musical theatre song of your choice. The comedic monologue for male or female applicants may be downloaded from the DFA website (Davidson.rcboe.org) under Parent tab/Audition. The prepared monologues and/or songs must be memorized and appropriate stage movement incorporated into your performance. If you are presenting a musical theatre song selection you must provide a CD of your accompaniment at the audition. You must introduce your pieces. Please include your name, title of selections, and the names of the playwrights or composer. Props, costumes, or theatrical makeup are not allowed, however, you will have one chair to use as a set piece, if you wish. | |
| Orchestra | <u>Applicants must:</u> Be interviewed individually to discuss training background and goals. Perform two contrasting selections of music of your choice comparable to level Suzuki Book three or higher. Bring one copy of your selections to the audition for the adjudicator. Perform D Major and G Major scales, two-octaves, at a tempo of QN=72, MEMORIZED. Sight-read music given at the audition of average difficulty. | |
| Piano | <u>Applicants must:</u> Be interviewed to discuss their training background and goals. Perform one piano solo. Because of the time frame of the audition the adjudicator may stop the applicant once his/her abilities have been determined. The piece does not have to be memorized. Bring the sheet music to the audition. Sight-read music given at the audition of average difficulty. Identify random notes on the staff as given by the adjudicator. | |
