6th Grade Summer Work

Welcome to TCM! This summer project is meant to serve 3 purposes.

- 1) Give you an opportunity to introduce yourself to me and your classmates in a way that truly shows your personality.
- 2) Give you an opportunity to become familiar with presentation software (PowerPoint, Prezi, etc.) that you'll be using often in class.
- 3) Give you a head start on practicing presenting. Presentations will take place starting the 2nd week of school.
- *If you do not have access to a computer, you may create a rough draft on paper of all of the information. When the school year starts, you'll have access to the media center to create the PowerPoint before and after school. However, if you have access to a computer, it would be best to complete this prior to the start of the school year.

Instructions

Create a PowerPoint (you may use other presentation software if you do not have PowerPoint) that addresses the criteria below. Slide 1 is worth 5 points. Slides 2-10 are worth 10 points. Spelling is worth 5 points. To receive the full points for each slide, make sure you have the required information and include pictures on each slide.

- Slide 1(Title Slide) Full name, picture of yourself, birthday
- Slide 2- People and/or pets that are important to you (friends, family, pets, etc.)
- Slides 3 and 4- Favorites (movies, shows, music artists, songs, YouTubers, books, food, any other favorite you can think of)
- Slide 5- Hobbies (what you spend time doing outside of school)
- Slide 6- Future (what you might want to be when you grow up; you can have more than 1 option)
- Slide 7- Favorite memory from elementary school
- Slide 8- What you're looking forward to about being a middle school student at TCM
- Slide 9- One goal you want to accomplish that's school-related and one goal you want to accomplish that's not school related (for example, reaching a new level on a game).
- Slide 10- Anything else you want me and the class to know about you
 - Be creative in the design and have fun with it! This is your introduction to us, so let your personality shine through!
 - Don't include too many words. Do you like PowerPoints with a lot of words on them? Probably
 not. Include just enough to answer the questions. You'll be presenting in front of the class, so
 you'll be able to talk more about each slide.
