
Response:

In what ways do comics differ from other forms of storytelling? Comics are able to portray action in a way that is unique from other art forms, as comics use a sequence of drawings to depict a narrative rather than one image. Exaggerating the actions and emotions in my stories helps tell the story more efficiently as it shows the reader what is important. I broadened my knowledge of the comic medium by experimenting with the different stories I want to tell.

Response:

My pieces explore many different story concepts and use various mediums such as marker, graphite, watercolor, and digital media. The variety has allowed me to understand how the medium affects the way a story is read. For example, the use of markers makes a page seem bright and lively, graphite can look rough and primitive, or watercolor creates a softer, more delicate scene. The choice of medium is made early in investigating the process, which includes brainstorming ideas, sketching concepts, and creating layouts for a page, which helps me visualize how panels will guide the reader's eye.

Idea(s):


I did this piece in only black and white to encompass the feeling of an old newspaper comic strip.

Materials:

Smooth Vellum Bristol paper, black alcohol ink applied with a dip pen

Process(es):

I chose a horizontal orientation to exaggerate the height of the first two panels.

Idea(s):

I used hatching to make the characters blend in to the dark setting.

Materials:

Smooth bristol paper and black alcohol ink to create a darker environment

Process(es):

Hatching and cross-hatching to show the dispersion of light from the lamp and around the characters.

I experimented with a dip pen for this piece to create a sense of depth within the thicker lines.
