More than 140 Richmond County students receive national recognition from the College Board

(AUGUSTA, GEORGIA) – More than 140 Richmond County School System (RCSS) students received national recognition for their exemplary performance on College Board assessments.

“We are thrilled to celebrate our students' strong academic performance in the classroom and on College Board assessments like the PSAT/NMSQT®, PSAT™ 10, and AP® exams,” said Dr. Malinda Cobb, Associate Superintendent of Academic Services. “There is so much that makes our students unique, and receiving this honor reinforces this as an asset for their future.”

Students from across the school system received several recognitions:

- One hundred and three students were named AP Scholars for outstanding AP exam scores and GPAs.
- Eleven of the 103 students were named AP Scholars with Honor
- Twenty-three students were named AP Scholars with Distinction
- Forty-one students received national recognitions for rural area, Black, Indigenous, and/or Latino students with exceptional scores on one or more College Board assessments (PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, and/or AP exams) and a GPA of 3.5 or higher.
