Ten Richmond County Schools named 2025 AP Honor Schools

(AUGUSTA, GEORGIA) – Ten Richmond County high schools have been recognized as 2025 Advanced Placement (AP) Honor Schools by the Georgia Department of Education.

"This recognition reflects the dedication of our students, teachers, and administrators in preparing students for college and careers," said Dr. Malinda Cobb, interim superintendent of schools. "By increasing access to AP courses, we're ensuring our students are challenged academically and have the opportunity to earn college credit before graduation."

The designation is based on performance in 2024 AP courses and exams and RCSS schools earned distinction in multiple categories:

AP STEM Achievement School – At least 50% of AP STEM exams score 3 or higher:

AP Access and Support School – At least 30% of AP exams taken by students from underrepresented backgrounds:

AP School of Distinction – At least 20% of students take AP exams, with 50% earning scores of 3 or higher:
